On 6th May 2022 27 members and associates visited the Bluebell Railway at Sheffield Park in East Sussex on a trip organised by Tim Healey.

Our party travelled in restored 1950s British Railways carriages behind Steam Locomotive 73082 "Camelot" from Sheffield Park to East Grinstead and back.

8th June 2022 "Play Petanque", a new event for the Probus sporting members, was held on at the Horsham & Shipley Community centre (HSCP). This initiative (now has charity status) started as a walking football club some 8 years ago, which has now grown to include Mens Shed woodworking and Petanque in addition to walking/darting football.

23rd June 2022 Rich Borrett organised and drove a group of 20 members and assosiates arround Amberley Museum. A most enjoyable and educational day was had by all although there was much debate about identifying certain items exihibited as 'of historical interest' whilst they were still in daily use in most members homes! There was however general agreement that public transport has improved in comfort.





1st July 2022 A nice summer's day for a walk by 19 Probus members and partners around the little known Coolham Airfield in Shipley was organised by



Laki Marangos. Our guide, Richard Harris, a trustee with the Horsham & Shipley Community Project had essentially created this walk from personal accounts of the airmen who lived and died here. The airfield had a short time span of a few months during 1944, but an important role in the preparation and execution of the Normandy landings.

4th July 2022 18 members and associates gathered, under the guidance of Clive and Angela Jones, to hone their skills with the croquet mallet, ball and hoop! After some skills practice and tests (with points that ment prizes) we were paired up and 2 rounds of match were under taken.

18th July 2022 On 18th July, almost the hottest day of the year, 27 members, Associates and partners embarked on a visit to the Palace of Westminster



organised by Tim Hulbert and Alan Price. We stayed cool for the first few hours in our air-conditioned coach. It started to warm up a bit when we got to the Houses of Parliament, though inside it remained fairly cool for most of the day. We started our tour in Westminster Hall, most of which has survived for over a 1000 years and was the site of the first parliament in 1265 and such other historic events as the trial of Charles 1. We were warmly greeted by our host, Lord Faulkner of Worcester who had been

instrumental in helping us to organise the visit.

11th August 2022 Simon Poulson organised a visit for eleven members to the D Day Story in Southsea on a very hot August day. We had arranged talks, tours and a buffet lunch with Andrew, the Curator. We are going to the Normandy D Day beaches for four nights in a months' time and are keen to learn more about what we will be seeing.



15th August 2022 Inter-Probus croquet event

This annual event was organised by Jonathan Isaacs president of the Sussex County Croquet Club at Southwick, and hosts of the event. Just a couple of

weeks ago it was the host site for the 2022 world golf croquet championships, so it was like playing at Wembley! Our Probus contingent of 15 people, members and Associates, was a quarter of the total from another 4 Probus clubs, namely Southdowns, West Chiltington, Storrington and Rother Valley. We were split into two groups; (a) beginners and (b) experienced i.e. those with a club handicap. The first 20 mins we were all given some tuition

depending on level of experience and then we were placed in groups of 5 or 6 pairs in a round robin competition. A buffet lunch was much appreciated as was a visit to the bar. Play resumed in the afternoon and eventually two sets of winners were announced according to the number of wins and hoops run. Ray and Valerie were runners up in group (a) and Laki and Anne Gill (guest at Southwick) winners of group (b). A lovely day of fun and as an annual event to be repeated on the 21st August 2023.

8th - 12th September Normandy Tour

Some 32 Probus folk and guests, including two couples from Storrington

Probus, set off on a four day trip to Normandy to visit the D-Day sites. We were 21 km from Caen when the news of the Queen's passing reached our phones. Quite a shock. For a time the mood was rather sombre, however we continued to our destination.

The next day was spent visiting the British and Canadian beach landings and memorials - Sword, Juno and Gold.

Day 3 was dedicated to the US side of the landings at Omaha and Utah

beaches. The American Cemetery with some 9,500 graves does not cover the enormity and horrors of this part of the campaign.

Day 4 was added to the itinerary to give us some light relief from the emotions of the D-Day landings, cemeteries and memorials. We visited Bayeux to see the famous 70 ft tapestry. Truly a magnificent embroidered story telling of the Norman invasion of 1066.







Departure day necessitated another early start to enable us to have a couple of hours at the picturesque port of Honfleur.

13th October 2022 Our Chairman, John Maunder, organised a successful Chairman's Invitation Lunch at the Southlands Barn, West Chiltington. There were 41 members, partners and assiociates present who enjoyed good food and company.

22nd October 2022 After last year's successful visit to the Biggin Hill Air Museum, Laki Maragos organised another visit.

27 October 2022 Chichester Festival Theatre Back-Stage Tour organised by Bruce Tompson and reported:
